

IMPACT WEEKENDS

TRAINING THOSE IN OUR CONGREGATIONS TO OPERATE IN THEIR GOD-BREATHED CALLINGS.

Impact Weekends are inspiring, relevant, and intensely practical. The instruction includes interactive lectures, videos, Q&A, and small group discussions. Those doing the teaching and training will be various OFN pastors and leaders.

The relationships forged in each cohort prove as vital as the skills and insights acquired. This allows leaders from the various One Focus Network congregations to both learn from each other and aid in forming relationships that bond our congregations together.

Ideally each cohort will have 25-30 people representing as many One Focus Network member churches and ministries as possible.

THE DETAILS

IMPACT WEEKENDS...

- Are designed to take place over eight weekends in a 2-year span.
- Will each take place at a different host church within the One Focus Network.
- Will run all day Saturday and Sunday until about 3 p.m. Saturdays will be filled with lecture, discussion, and activation. Sundays will entail being a part of the weekend service at the host church, lunch, and a final session.
- Will follow an 8-topic syllabus which includes: Good Theology and Why it Matters; Communicating Truth: Hearing, Preparation, and Delivery; and Pastoring the Flock: Shepherding without Getting Bit.

When you discuss this with those who you will be recommending for Impact Weekends, please be sure to inform them that they are committing to eight weekends over a two-year period.
